# Sewing therapy inspires winner's future career designing clothing for disabled

**DALLAS, TX – April 14, 2011** – Courtney Powers, a University of North Texas fashion student, grabbed the hearts of judges with a winning collection that garnered her The Fashion Group International of Dallas Career Day Paris American Academy Best of Show Award on April 1, 2011.

Miss Powers, who nearly lost her arm in a car crash, received the coveted scholarship which included tuition for **a** summer semester, airfare and spending money to attend the acclaimed Paris American Academy in Paris, France. While in therapy for her injured arm, she was advised to take up sewing, which led to her enrollment in UNT's fashion design program and a planned career designing clothing for the disabled.

More than 450 entries were submitted by students from 42 colleges and universities across 12 states who attended Career Day. Students competed in fashion design, merchandising and fashion illustration for more than \$30,000 in scholarship awards from the Fashion Group International of Dallas Foundation Fund, the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA), Dallas Market Center, DAVACO, Four-Legged Fashion Fund, Brad Hughes & Associates, Lori Veith Sales, The National Needleart Association, Neiman-Marcus Willow Bend and Cure Couture who sponsored a scholarship in memory of Linda Segal, a Texas Designer who did not survive her battle with breast cancer.

Fashion Group's Career Day Dallas is the longest running and largest fashion career event of its kind in the country, attracting more than 1100 students and faculty. The full day of seminars, exhibits, and keynote speakers culminates with a spectacular runway fashion show featuring the winners of the fashion design scholarship competition in several categories.
